Member consultation on Migration

Eurodiaconia would like to invite all interested member organisations to a one day consultation on migration in Brussels on 11 May 2010. Eurodiaconia has recognized that migration is a topic which impacts many aspects of its members' work today and it will continue to do so as migration increases. Eurodiaconia has therefore integrated this topic into its work programme for 2010, starting with a consultation meeting among members to better understand work being carried out in this area. In autumn 2009 Eurodiaconia was contacted by organization from Greece – Diakonia Greece – who was ruled that the standard benefits paid to its poorest citizens interested in membership of Eurodiaconia. The organization was founded by Father Vasileious, an Orthodox hospital Chaplain who saw a need to provide support for lonely and abandoned patients in hospital. The service started as a volunteer effort but has grown into a small NGO with 4 full time staff and over 300 active volunteers. As well as his clear commitment to Diaconia, Father Vasileious has a strong management orientation and has spent a lot of has a strong management orientation and has spent a lot of time organizing the work. A bespoke IT programme has been developed — DiakoniaNet which manages all the data needed for the project and records eventhing related to the volunteers and others. It is used daily by the staff. This programme is a very advanced volunteer management tool and could be very interesting to other volunteer organizations.

Diakonia Greece has been recognized by several public bodies and has had an award from the President of Greece for its services.

Heather was able to meet with Rev Dr Adamantios Avgoustidis who is now responsible in the Church of Greece for Diaconia. It was possible to discuss the current situation of Diaconia in Greece and the possible developments in the future. It was agreed that Eurodiaconia and the Church of Greece would keep in close contact, particularly through Father Adamantios and Diakonia Greece and in the future we could explore membership possibilities.
